 - a. Board Chair: David Sloan

Sherwin Petersen is our representative on the Board of Directors. SAW provide advice and provincial promotion on the issues of watershed management. SAW provides provincial funding of programs for its members. SAW is working to develop Best Management Practices for Urban Municipalities. SAW provides a provincial conference each year, this year in Moosomin, next year in Gravelbourg. WUQWATR nominated the Federated Cooperative Ltd. Refinery wastewater improvement project for the SAW Watershed Stewardship Award and was successful in getting the award. SAW works with a number of provincial organizations and initiatives such as APAS, SUMA, SARM and the Aquatic Invasive Species task force. SAW provides a booth at Agribition.

what is done on the ground.
